about second language acquisition.)		
5. What language(s) do you speak at home? With		
friends? At work? At school? Elsewhere? Why? (Try		
to incorporate what you learned about		
sociolinguistics.)		
6. How does your speech vary throughout your		
day? (This is true even in you are using one		
language all day.) (Try to incorporate what you		
learned about sociolinguistics.)		
7. How has language shaped your academic life?		
Your work life? Your social life?		

Your essay should be two to three pages long, typed, double-spaced, with 12pt font and one inch margins. Your grade will be based on the content provided and your correct use of information from this course, with at least three references to the textbook. You should write for an audience of your peers who have not taken ELL101.
